



# **BILL CURRY**

Bill Curry has spent his entire adult life as a leader and communicator. His NFL career included two Super Bowl titles and a stint as the President of the NFL Players Association. Bill served as head football coach for Georgia Tech ('80-'86), the University of Alabama ('87-'89), and the University of Kentucky ('90-'96). In 1989, Bill was recognized as the nation's top coach with the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Award.

Since 1997, Bill has come into millions of homes each football Saturday as an analyst for ESPN. Combining self-deprecating humor, riveting tales from his playing days, and fiery, straight-from-the-heart passion, Bill has quickly become one of the most sought-after speakers in the country. On September 20, 2006, the American Football Coaches Association announced Bill as the recipient of the 2007 Amos Alonzo Stagg Award in honor of his outstanding service toward the advancement of the best interests of football.

Curry played his college football at Georia Tech and his NFL career was spent with the Baltimore Colts, Houston Oilers, and Los Angeles Rams. Recently retired, he currently resides in Atlanta.

# PAUL FINEBAUM

Paul Finebaum is considered the leading sports authority in the South and the "Voice of the SEC." He formerly served as host of the Paul Finebaum Radio Network, which was based out of Birmingham and has been syndicated on stations from South Carolina to St. Louis and heard nationally on Sirius XM Radio (Channel 91).

Paul Finebaum arrived in Birmingham in 1980 and became a columnist and investigative reporter for the Birmingham Post-Herald. Finebaum's work has earned him over 250 national, regional and area sports writing awards. Finebaum joined the Mobile Press Register in 2001 where he wrote a twice-weekly column with the column syndicated to other newspapers. In 2011, Finebaum began writing a college football column for SI.com. His Christmas Eve column on a radio caller from lowa suffering from cerebral palsy was among the most critically acclaimed stories of his career. Finebaum found himself embroiled at the center of one of biggest college sports stories in America in 2011 - the poisoning of the famous trees on Toomer's Corner at Auburn University. The man charged called



the Finebaum show, claiming to have poisoned the trees. The audio of the call was played on nearly every national radio show and television newscast in the nation. In the aftermath, Finebaum was featured on the NBC Nightly News with Brian Williams, appeared on CNN, ESPN, MSNBC and several other networks.

In 2011, the publication of a book exclusively about the unique culture of the Finebaum Show. Great Call: Why The Finebaum Show Is America's Barbershop, was written by Author Tom Ward. Finebaum's list of media appearances are extensive. He has established himself as a powerful and throught provoking voice in the world of college athletics moving forward.

A 1978 graduate of the University of Tennessee, Finebaum resides in Birmingham with his wife, Dr. Linda Hudson, an internist, who currently serves as chief of medicine at St. Vincent's Hospital.

Former UCLA linebacker Ramogi Huma founded the National College Players Association (NCPA) after watching the NCAA suspend his All-American teammate Donnie Edwards for accepting groceries when his scholarship money ran out at the end of the month. By the end of his freshman year, Huma realized that, despite the

billions of dollars that college athletes generate, the NCAA enforces rules that leave college athletes across the nation without basic protections. Huma decided to form a student group that would allow college athletes to voice their concerns and change NCAA rules. The NCPA soon recruited over 1000 football and basketball players from universities across the nation, and had success in changing several NCAA rules. Since then, more than 14,000 current and former Division I athletes have joined the NCPA. After earning his BA in sociology, Huma went on to earn a Master of Public Health (MPH) at UCLA. While in graduate school, Huma continued his work in

expanding the NCPA. The NCPA has been featured in many media outlets such as 60 Minutes, ABC's World News Tonight, CNN, ESPN, Fox Sports, Sports Illustrated, The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, the LA Times, the New York Times, the Chronicle of Higher Education, and numerous radio programs.

Zoya Johnson currently serves as the student assistant coach for the UNC Women's Gymnastics team. A former UNC gymnast, Ms. Johnson was an outstanding gymnast, earning first-team All-EAGL honors, first-team EAGL all-tournament honors, and competing at NCAA regionals. As a senior, Johnson captured the individual vault title

mer Gymnast; current Student Assistant Coach, UNC-Chapel Hill @MochoFinest

at the EAGL championships, and earned first-team EAGL All-Tournament honors. During her outstanding career four-year career, Johnson sustained several concussions and was forced to withdraw from school twice. She is an Exercise and Sports Science major on track to graduate this spring.





#### MARK KELSO

Former NFL Player; current Advancement Director, St. Mary's
High School (NY)

Mark Kelso has excelled as a pro football player, a grade school teacher and now as a high school administrator. He currently is the director of advancement at St. Mary's High School in Lancaster. Kelso also serves as an assistant coach on the St. Mary's football staff. Kelso may be best remembered as one of the most beloved Buffalo Bills in history. He played free safety for the Bills from 1986-1993 where he consistently

was at the top of the National Football League's interception leaders. His former head coach Marv Levy said Kelso was the biggest overachiever he had coached as he rose from a practice squad player to starter and then to team captain. Kelso also started in all four of the Bills Super Bowls during the early '90's. With 30 career interceptions, he is third on Buffalo's all-time list. In '89, after "probably three or four concussions," Kelso began wearing the now famous "gazoo" helmet; a protective foam covering over the actual helmet, in order to help prevent any more concussions. He wore the helmet for the final five years of his career. That helmet now sits in the

Pro Football Hall of Fame as a gift from Kelso's teammate Jim Kelly upon his induction to the Hall. Kelso is a proud graduate of The College of William & Mary where he received his Bachelor's degree in business administration. He was an honorable mention all-American for the football team and an academic all-American in the classroom. After his playing career, he went back to school and received his Masters in Education from Canisius College. He is currently the Director of Advancement at St. Mary's High School, a Catholic coeducational high school in Western New York.

Jason Mihalik is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Exercise and Sport Science. He currently serves as the director of the EXSS Musculoskeletal Cadaver Anatomy Laboratory, and will teach courses in Biomechanics (EXSS 385) and Undergraduate Research Methods (EXSS 273), and assists with the Graduate Statistics and Research

Former UNC-CH Men's Basketball Player; current Director of Basketball Operations, University of Alabama-Birmingham

Bobby Frasor just finished his first year as the director of basketball operations at University of Alabama-Birmingham. Frasor was a former men's basketball studentathlete at UNC-Chapel Hill from 2005 to 2009. He played in 109 games in his collegiate career, started 42 times, and was named ACC All-Freshman Team. He finished his

career at UNC with a record of 124-22, including three ACC regular-season titles, two ACC postseason championships, two Final Four appearances, and helped the team to a NCAA Championship Title in 2009. After graduation, Frasor played professional basketball in Bulgaria and Cyprus, and then served as the assistant video coordinator at his alma mater. He received a bachelors in communications at UNC-CH.

Fmmett Gill is currently an assistant professor in the Department of Social Work at North Carolina Central University. Dr. Gill is also the founder of the Student-Athlete's Human Rights (SAHRP) - (a 501@4 organization dedicated to social justice for studentathletes) and an assistant professor at the North Carolina Central University (NCCU)

Dr. Gill's scholarship focuses on the intersection between social work and collegiate athletics. His latest work, Integrating Sports into Social Work Education, will appear in an upcoming issue of the Journal of Social Work Education. Dr. Gill has one daughter Simone, one son Emmett III, and is a former student-athlete.



#### MICHAEL MCCANN.

Professor of Law and Director of Sports and Entertainment Law Institute at University of New Hampshire School of Law; Legal Analyst & Writer, Sports Illustrated/Sl.com @McCannSportsLaw Michael McCann one of the nation's leading experts in sports law, a seasoned sports attorney, and an award-winning teacher and scholar. He is also Sports Illustrated's legal analyst, the "Sports Law" columnist on SI.com (CNNSI), and the on-air legal analyst for NBA TV. Professor McCann is the author of 18 law review articles and more than 160 legal columns and investigative articles for Sports Illustrated and Sl.com. His

law review articles have been published in the Yale Law Journal, Wisconsin Law Review, and Boston College Law Review, among other prominent law reviews. One recent and notable article is American Needle v. NFL: An Opportunity to Reshape Sports Law. In addition to his sports law expertise, Professor McCann is an established expert in media and broadcasting law, antitrust law, contract law, criminal law, law and psychology, food and drug law, disability law, and law and analytics. Prior to becoming a law professor, Professor McCann served as counsel to college football star Maurice Clarett in his lawsuit against the National Football League and its age

eligibility rule He also served as a visiting researcher at Harvard Law School and legal counsel to U.S. Congressman Marty Meehan.

Harvey Perlman, Chancellor of the University of Nebraska, is regarded as one of the nation's leading authorities on the confluence of academics and athletics. Perlman graduated from Nebraska with a BA degree in history followed by a juris doctorate with highest honors. After teaching across the nation, Perlman returned to his alma mater to serve as Dean of the College of Law for 15 years and was named Chancellor in 2001.

Under his tutelage, Nebraska has experienced tremendous growth, including increased international partnerships and becoming a member of the Big Ten Conference. Mr. Perlman's areas of focus include torts and intellectual property law. 


